- 3. Update from new co-chairs.
  - a. Discussed addition of 2 new members
  - b. Discussed the desire to make the CAC an adaptable rapidly responding group with the goal of garnering increasing respect from public, media, and government.
- 4. Update on any other action items from previous meetings:
  - a. State of Provincial Fisheries Management Manitoba Sustainable Development provided a
    response to our Fisheries Management letter. ACTION: All members to review the letter on
    our TWS Manitoba Chapter website.
  - b. Surface Water Management legislation ACTION: Members advise CAC as to the status of any future surface water management legislation, and how /if we could respond.
  - c. Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation/East Side Road Authority Freedom Road Environmental Assessment has been submitted for public review. ACTION: Members are encouraged to review and report back to CAC if there is an interest in providing a response by March 15<sup>th</sup>.
  - d. MB Minnesota Transmission Line. Public Hearing Scheduled for spring 2016. CAC provided a previous response to this project. ACTION: Members are encouraged to review public hearing information and report back to CAC if there is an interest in providing a response.
     2 members recuse themselves from any involvement with this matter, but invite other CAC members to consider reviewing/participating.
  - e. Potential wildlife research projects for recommendation to Dr. Rick Baydack's wildlife class;
    - i. Action: Each member suggests two project ideas by submit to chairs. Ideas to date: Analyze results of Elk collaring study in SE MB, identify current distribution of feral swine in MB, prevalence of trichinosis (in black bears in Manitoba, prevalence of brainworm (*P. tenuis*) in white-tailed deer in the City of Winnipeg.
  - f. The status of the Qamanirjuaq caribou herd including the updates from the bqmb. No action, tabled until more information becomes available after 2017 spring survey.

- g. Whitewater Lake drainage proposal. Currently being reviewed by Sustainable Development, waiting for more information from proponent. No updates posted on government website.
  - i. ACTION: CAC members to continue following this proposal, and report back at next meeting.

## 5. New items

- a. Discussion on wildlife feeding policy within the City of Winnipeg, as per recent communication between members. ACTION: These three CAC members to review and develop a draft letter to the City of Winnipeg and or Sustainable Development for sharing with the group by March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2016.
- b. Manitoba Hydro has release 1<sup>st</sup> round of public engagement material for a new transmission project near Birtle, Manitoba. **ACTION**: **Member to review this project and provide** information to CAC regarding whether there is any value in engaging by March 15<sup>th</sup>.
- c. Wapusk National Park New park management plan to be released in March. **Action:** Co-chair to circulate to CAC when it is released.
- d. Status of Moose Conservation General discussion on the lack of improvements in moose populations in Manitoba. Reports of further population collapses as identified by recent surveys. ACTION: CAC may want to consider a 2<sup>nd</sup> letter to provincial government if evidence of improved management (and or development of a moose management plan) is not demonstrated in the coming months.
